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### Visual and Performing Arts at U-Prep

The Visual and Performing Arts program at U-Prep is rich with opportunities for students to develop their creative energies, enrich their lives in meaningful ways, and find balance amid a rigorous academic curriculum. Under the tutelage of competent and caring teachers, students learn to tap into and develop their innate ability to think and express themselves through the arts. U-Prep junior high and high school students have multiple opportunities to engage in instrumental and vocal music, theatre, visual arts, and dance. Notably, 87% of U-Prep's student body is enrolled in at least one course visual and performing arts course!

A MESSAGE FROM SUPERINTENDENT/PRINCIPAL PETERSON

Among the list of fine arts program offerings is one not offered anywhere else locally – dance. At the helm of the dance program is Marissa Kinneavy who joined U-Prep in 2008. Under Mrs. Kinneavy's leadership, the program has grown to serve 128 students, Dance I – Dance VI! Courses focus on multiple dance forms including ballet, modern, jazz, and musical theatre taught at beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels. The advanced dance courses include opportunities for student choreography, and all dance students participate in two major performances year. The 8th annual Just Dance! Event is coming up, March 3 and March 4. Please see the VAPA NEWS section for more details.

U-Prep also hosts a competitive dance team. This year's dance team consists of 14 students who auditioned for the opportunity. The dance team performs at various school functions and travels out of the area to compete against prestigious dance studios. The monthly school newsletter highlights the awards earned from competitions. This month, the dance team will travel to Fair Oaks for a new dance competition. Teams from Sacramento and the bay area will be present. Most of the competition will come from private dance studios. Other events happening in the spring include two conventions and competitions in Santa Clara and Sacramento. Go Panthers!

For the first time, Mrs. Kinneavy and the U-Prep Dance Team hosted a dance clinic. Twenty-eight youngsters, ages 8 to 13, from across the Redding community worked with U-Prep dancers to create a challenging and fun routine. This routine became the Varsity Boys Basketball halftime show the following Tuesday. Congratulations to all participants and the U-Prep Dance Team on providing outstanding entertainment at the home game against Sutter! Due to the high level of interest, the dance clinic will be offered again next year.



## The International Student Exchange Program at U-Prep

At U-Prep, students are prepared to achieve all five Student Learning Outcomes (SLO), one of which stipulates that a U-Prep student will be: A Positive Member of a Diverse Society -- Able to demonstrate compassion and empathy throughout the community, both locally and globally. One strategy the school uses to help our students serve locally and think globally involves inviting international students to visit our school and community, and sending our students out of the country to embark on an eye-opening and life-changing international experience. Since 2013, the Confucius Classroom at U-Prep has hosted students from China, and sent U-Prep students to China.

Each year, a group of 20-30 Chinese high school students visit Redding. Warmly welcomed by U-Prep students and families, they immediately feel at home and immensely enjoy their experiences at school and with their American host families. They are interested in observing the frequent interactions between the teachers and students, and compare this to their learning activities in China. They exchange ideas and compare notes with American students, which all enhances both the Chinese and American students' interest in global issues, cultural awareness and general knowledge. Opening their home and heart to Chinese visitors, host families give the visitors and themselves a rare opportunity to gain a new perspective, many fond memories, and, in many cases, a new family member for life. Much of the feedback from host families informs us that the visits of these international students give them an insight into the world beyond Redding.

U-Prep administrators have given their full support to the efforts of Confucius Classroom in sponsoring our students to step out of the country and see the world. To date, six summer trips to China have seen nearly 200 students visit more than 20 cities in over half of China's 32 provinces. International learning and knowledge propelled our students towards acceptance and understanding of an array of different cultural and community perspectives, enhanced their awareness, multi-faceted learning strategies, and improved their analytical and problem solving skills. Chinese language learners, in particular, saw their language proficiency soar through practical immersion.



## The International Student Exchange Program at U-Prep...cont.

Reflection papers by students upon their return from China revealed many interesting insights. For example, students reported that their maturity and social poise, fueled by the necessity to confront challenges outside a familiar support network and comfort zone, noticeably improved. In-depth interactions with another family in a foreign land fostered an enhanced appreciation of parents and families. This is often the most noticeable change. Other shifts included enhanced self-confidence and self-esteem as a result of self-development and awareness while being away from home. The tremendous sense of accomplishment upon program completion encourages students to develop their thinking, make informed decisions, and strive to attain fresh goals.

U-Prep graduates who went on China trips found themselves more comfortable in 'foreign' environments when they started their college studies. Even upon graduation from college, these students reported that their overseas experience with another language and culture was valued by prospective employers in almost every field.

All U-Prep staff take great pride in preparing our students for their college life and beyond. We will continue to make efforts to help prepare U-Prep students to become a positive member of a diverse society and a qualified global citizen with broad international perspectives. The international exchange program of U-Prep has proved to be an effective way to help our students reach that goal.

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


# JUNIOR THEATER FESTIVAL






