Dear Parents,

Over the course of the 2017-18 school year, our staff was trained and certified in the ALICE Training Institute best practices for school safety. The next step includes training all of our students. However, before we initiate training protocols with them, the school safety trainers would like to inform our families that the trainings will be age appropriate, will occur at individual gradelevels, will include an action-based approach to keeping oneself safe, and will be designed to minimize potential stressors.

Research has shown us that the traditional "lockdown" where we have trained our staff and students to hide and shelter-in-place, is not the best practice in a situation involving an armed intruder. This new approach (ALICE) provides our school with options to respond based on information that is available. This includes the ability to evacuate or escape a dangerous situation, if that is the best option available.

The topic of managing an armed intruder is not a conversation that we want to have, especially in a school setting. However, it is necessary. Beginning the 2018-19 school year, the school safety team will be visiting classrooms to discuss safety protocols. As mentioned, these conversations will take into account the grade level in each room. This is the time when students will hear about ALICE protocols in an age-appropriate way, and be in an environment (classroom setting) where students will feel more comfortable asking questions.

This topic gets to the heart of what is most important to the people who work in our school, and that is the safety of our students. We remain committed to deploying the best practices in school safety for any situation that may arise. Our students and staff are our priority.

The process to access bussing per Shasta Union High School District transportation policy is as follows:

- Parents notify the school office via a written request for bus transportation; a note may be brought in by the student or faxed to the office (245=2791). This request needs to include the name(s) of the student who will be riding the bus, the requested bus stop, the frequency of transportation needed (e.g. Today Only, When Necessary, Regularly), and the name and signature of the parent.
- For safety purposes the school office authorizes the request, notifies the SUHSD transportation department, and provides the student rider with an initial bus pass.
- The student rider presents the authorized bus pass to their bus driver when they board the bus for the first time. School bus transportation will not be allowed without the bus pass. Once the bus drive receives the pass, the student rider is considered approved for transportation.

A Note from U-Prep Health Office

Will you be 7th or 9th grade next year?

74 Grade

 7^{th} grade students will need proof of Tdap booster shot before they are allowed to start school next fall. Some 6^{th} grade students may have had the Tdap vaccine. If so, we have it in their health file. We just need proof for students that have YET to receive this vaccine.

Some 7^{th} grade students may choose to get their 2^{nd} varicella shot in preparation for 9^{th} grade at the same time as the Tdap to avoid having to get another shot in two years. (See 9^{th} grade requirement below)

9th Grade

 9^{th} grade students need proof of their 2^{nd} Varicella (chicken pox) vaccine. If you have already received a 2^{nd} varicella shot there is no need to get another one. We have that information on file. We just need proof for students that have YET to receive this vaccine.




