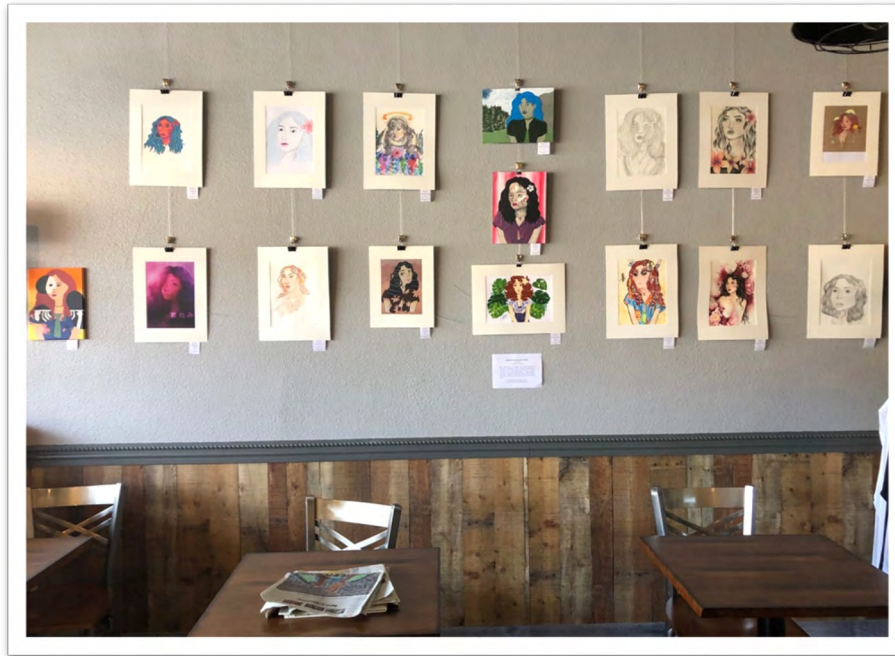

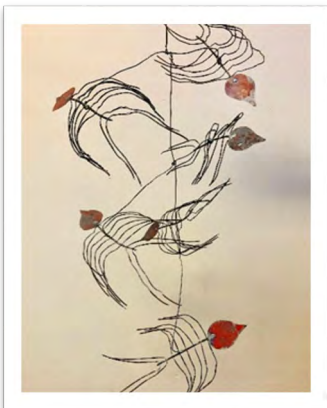
AP and HONORS ART on DISPLAY

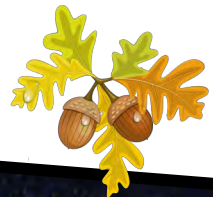

All 10th and 11th grade students will be taking the PSAT on Wednesday, October 16th. The PSAT is the best preparation for the SAT, which is a college entrance exam that assesses academic readiness when applying to a 4 year college. The College Board will email an access code to view online score reports in December. Students will also receive a paper score report.



The U-Prep Counseling Center is excited to introduce Naviance, a web-based service that provides students and families with a variety of features, one being Naviance Student.

Naviance Student allows your student to:

- ✦ Get involved in the planning and advising process – Build a resume, complete online surveys, and manage timelines and deadlines for making decisions about colleges and careers
- ✦ Research colleges – Compare GPA, standardized test scores, and other statistics to actual historical data from our school for students who have applied and been admitted in the past
- ✦ Research careers – Research hundreds of careers and career clusters, and take career assessments
- ✦ Create plans for the future – Create goals and to-dos, and complete tasks assigned by the school to better prepare your student for future college and career goals.

Naviance Student also lets us share information with you and your student about upcoming meetings and events, local scholarship opportunities, and other resources for college and career information.

AP College Board Test Registration News, 2019-2020

Beginning in the 2019-2020 school year, the College Board (Pre-AP, AP) is introducing new resources and processes designed to help students earn college credit and placement. Here's what you and your student need to know:

- College Board is now asking students to register for AP Exams in the fall rather than the spring.
- The window to purchase Exams will be officially announced when school opens. This information will be sent out via the school App, School Messenger notifications, and through other communications venues.
- The AP Exam fee isn't changing. However, there will be a \$40 fee for late registration (after Nov. 15) and a \$40 cancellation or unused exam fee.
- U-Prep will continue to use the Total Registration system as the mechanism for test payment services. Your student's AP teachers will be working with students and parents to facilitate test payment through Total Registration.

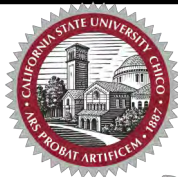

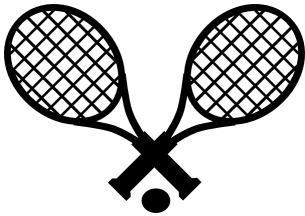


We have a lot of speed this year and have our sites set on being first place in our league for both boys and girls teams. Go Panthers!

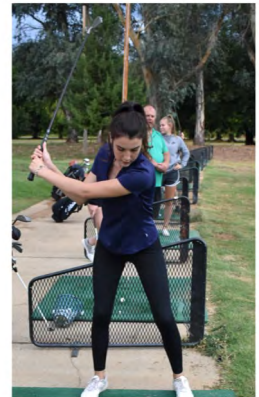
Girls Tennis

Girls Golf

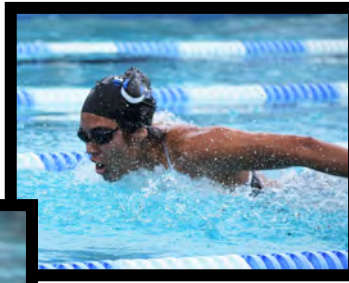

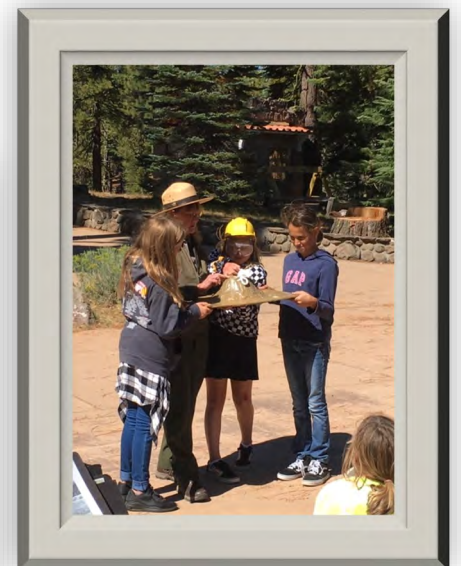
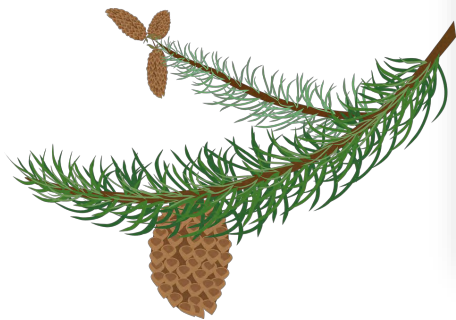
IRELAND, WALES, SCOTLAND & ENGLAND
