

PURSUING EXCELLENCE TOGETHER

It is our pleasure to introduce U-Prep's refreshed Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs). As part of our continuous improvement process we periodically reflect upon our School Mission, Vision, and SLOs with stakeholders. Data obtained through surveys (student, staff, parent), through student achievement outcomes (state assessment, Advanced Placement exams, PSAT and SAT exams, academic grades), among other sources of data contributed to the reflection process and helped shape the revised Student Learning Outcomes. During Senior Exit Presentations, seniors conduct a culminating presentation that is anchored in the SLOs. This is one example of the many ways that our SLOs show up within our programs and operations.

Our school improvement systems overlay very well with the school accreditation self-study process ("WASC"), which was formally initiated at the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year. Five (5) Stakeholder focus groups worked diligently throughout the school year to reflect upon school progress, review data and evidence, and contribute to updated school goals. A huge THANK YOU goes out to the parents and junior high and high students that joined our entire staff and school board trustees in doing this school improvement work together. Much time was devoted to ensure a thorough and thoughtful experience. This year, we will host a virtual visit from a WASC Visiting Team composed of educators. 8th Grade Perspective
