

PANTHERS HUSCHOOL ATHLETICS

Coming off a historic fall season that saw seven of our eight varsity teams capture section titles in their respective divisions, awards and accolades continue to come in from the success seen this fall. After capturing the Division 4 state volleyball title, with a thrilling five-set win over Exeter, both players and coach are getting the recognition they deserve. Coach Tawni Kramer was recently named Northern Section Coach of the Year and junior Kaitlyn Cabral Northern Section MVP. Morgan Wilding joined Cabral on the Northern Section 1st-team, with senior Ashlee Kraft and sophomore Elle Weaver being named to the NSCIF 2nd-team. Most recently, Cabral was named a Maxpreps All-American and is believed to be the first Panther in school history to earn such recognition.

Varsity football Head Coach, Dustin Fortenberry, and his staff have been the Lion's All-Star Game North coaching staff. U-Prep seniors Carter Abel, Connor Gilbreath, Riley Hays, and Payton Henderson have all been selected to play in the prestigious game June 18th. Congratulations also go to Abel and Gilbreath for being named 2nd Team All-State as published by calhisports.com.

The winter sports teams have their sights set on building on the success of the fall, with varsity boys and girls basketball sitting atop the Northern Athletic League standings at the midway point of league. Varsity girls and boys soccer are both undefeated in league play and rank at the top of their division with league wrapping up for all four teams the second week of February. Before league play, all four

teams found plenty of success throughout their preseason schedules. The varsity boys won the Jamie Angley Hornet Classic, defeating Enterprise in the tournament championship. Senior Kameron Morphew was named the tournament MVP, while seniors Justin Berglund and Riley Hays earned all-tournament honors. Morphew also spent a week in January as the Record Searchlight athlete of the week. The varsity girls battled, and beat, some of the top teams in the area during their preseason. Along the way, freshman JoAnna Warren spent a week as the Record Searchlight athlete of the week while senior co-captains Jordan McCoy and Melanie Lindsey continue to excel. The boys and girls soccer teams are being led in their success by a handful of seniors. On the boys side, Sawyer Bonnin is leading the team in goals with sophomore Bailey Wurzer second in goals. The girls soccer team is led by a trio of seniors in Becca Gaido, Isabel Lendman, and Ryanne Ampi. The girls are seeking their third consecutive section title to cap off their high school careers.

Back indoors, the girls cheerleading team recently competed in the first-ever Northern Section championship competition for sideline cheer. The girls were one of eight teams to compete at Chico HS and represented our school extremely well in the finals.

Wrestling also continues to push towards the ultimate goal of wrestling on Saturday of the Masters Section tournament, held at Corning HS this year. The team kicked off January with a third place finish at the Anderson tournament, placing higher than

all other Northern Section teams at the tournament. Their third place finish is the best finish for a UPrep team in school history at the Anderson tourney. Adrian Nasise and Dylan Higgins both finished in third place in their weight class at Anderson. Zoe Nye, Finley Nye and Charles Chan all took first place in their weight class at the Corning Novice kickoff.

In junior high sports, the 7th grade boys, and Coach Mark Stephens, won the tournament championship of the Foothill tournament, beating Bidwell of Chico in the tournament championship. All three basketball teams are off to great starts in their league seasons. In girls sports, soccer is competing with both royal and white squads. Coach Brian Salado has the royal team off to a strong start, while Haylee Ward, a Simpson University soccer player, is leading the White team.














Boys Varsity Soccer




