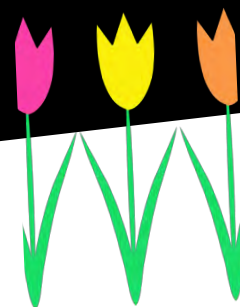

Facility Update

We are very pleased to share that the Stuart Gym will be receiving some much needed renovations over the course of April through August/September. The scope of this project will include:

Repairing water damage in the gym interior walls;
Replacing the roof;
Repairing ceiling damage in the weight room and locker room areas; and,
Resurfacing the gym floor.

As previously shared with parents of current P.E. students, the Stuart Gym locker room will be off limits for safety purposes until the project is completed. Our P.E. teachers are modifying their end-of-year course plans in response to allow for continued physical activity; the Hoosier and Activity Gym will remain unaffected throughout construction, yet we hope the weather is conducive to outdoor activities.

Many of our athletic teams and all of our P.E. students utilize the Stuart Gym, the weight room, and locker room throughout the year. Consequently, we are full speed ahead with securing access to alternative locations in order that our students and teams are minimally impacted by the project. Administration will be working with coaches to setup summer and fall practice and game schedules.

Thanks to the passage of the Shasta Union High School District bond, facility revitalization will continue to occur at our site. Although timelines have not yet been established, we do know that significant attention will be given to the Activity Gym locker room, plumbing and electrical systems, and safety issues (e.g. fencing, automated locks). As plans for these projects come to fruition they will be communicated to our school-community.

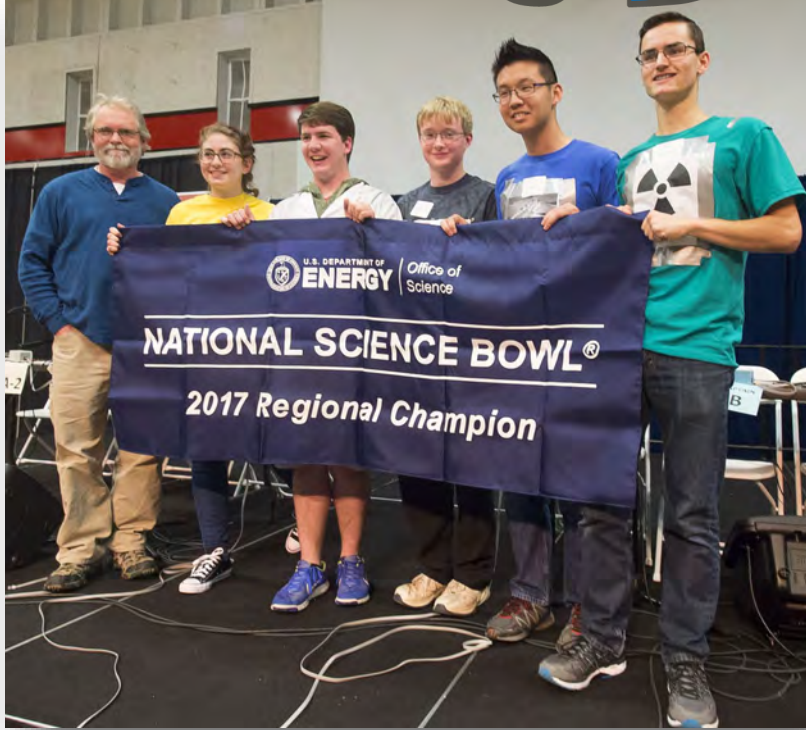

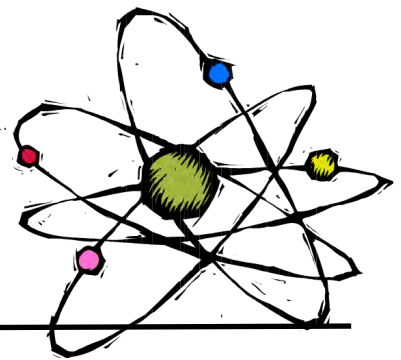

Women in STEM

The 13th Women in STEM conference was held at Simpson University on Saturday March 18. U-Prep was represented by about 40 of our 6, 7, & 8th grade ladies. In total about 350 girls from 55 north state schools attended.

Attendees began talking and trying new ideas after having the opportunity at the beginning of the program to explore various STEM labs set up around the gym. Hands-on time was followed by an inspirational keynote address delivered Dr. Lea Tate. Dr. Tate's speech provided motivation for our young ladies to network and find a mentor in a field of study they are interested in. The remainder of the day saw participants attending 4 sessions from the 31 careers that were offered. Each session was 90 minutes long and allowed the girls to see what goes in to obtaining specific careers and what those careers are all about. Chemical biology, robotics, coding, medical, dental, engineering, and forestry, were some of the careers showcased that day and all sessions were led by women in the field.

U-Prep participants ended the day excited about careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math with feelings of empowerment to pursue careers in these fields.

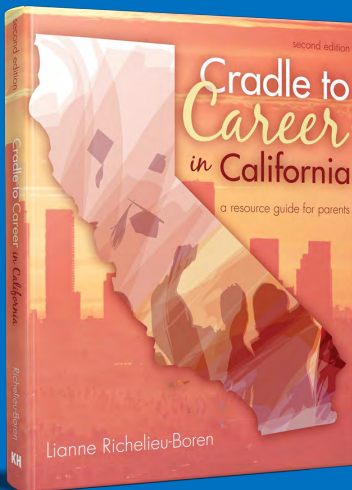

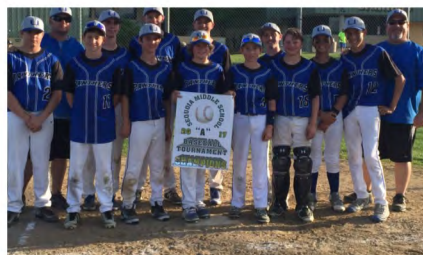

Junior High Student Government

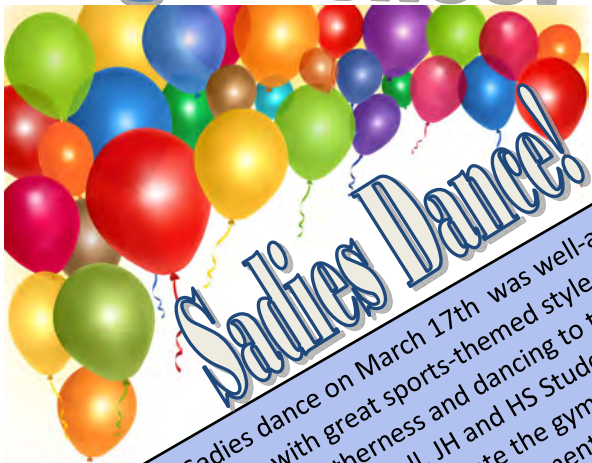
The Junior High Spring Kickoff Dance was a huge success with almost 200 junior high students in attendance!

For clarification purposes, school districts, schools, including charters, are not allowed to require "volunteer hours" or payment of a fee in lieu of performing volunteer hours as a condition of admission, enrollment, continued enrollment, sibling preference, attendance, participation in educational activities or receipt of credit or privileges related to educational activities (EC Section 49011c). However, U-Prep still requests – not requires - that parents perform 10 hours per school year as a means to strengthen school-community relations and assist in the development of school programs and services.
