
## 2017 PRESIDENTIAL INAUGURATION

My impression of China has drastically changed with this trip. Normally, I would only visit China to see my relatives for a short period of time, and I usually stayed in the densely populated cities with them. However, because this time I was able to explore nearly all of China's ancient wonders, not only was I able to learn about and appreciate Chinese culture, but I was able to visit regions I had never experienced before in China. Each of the ethnic minorities that we visited each had their own unique customs, but at the end of the day, they were all united under the Chinese flag. Visiting more of China gave me this good impression of unity among hundreds of millions of people, who are able to work together, talk together, and play together. I definitely saw this during the convention at Zhengzhou; there was always a few strong leaders, but the rest of the team, despite not knowing each other for more than a week, were able to easily, efficiently, and effectively cooperate together. Interacting with Chinese students who were about my age gave me an opportunity to see what their view on society was, giving me the impression that although Chinese students are extremely competitive, they are compassionate for one another, constantly referring to one another as "brother" or "sister", and helping those in need whenever possible. Visiting China also allowed me to appreciate not only being Chinese, but also being able to live in America and having such high standards for quality of life. I'm glad that I live in a country that values public health and abides by law and rules so strictly, but I have to admit that I envy China's top quality servicing, especially in the food industry.

I am very grateful towards my parents for giving me this amazing and enlightening experience, but more so towards Dr. Cheng, who was the coordinator and supervisor for the whole trip. The itinerary he set up was at a very comfortable pace, and his selections of points of interest were enjoyable and quite superb, giving us a thorough experience of China. I am in awe of his ability to manage forty-plus people during an international trip. I would also like to thank Ms. Johnson for incorporating the music program into this trip, and the parent-chaperones who kept the trip safe and orderly. ~U-Prep Student Kevin L.





### More on the July trip to China...

One of the goals of the trip was to attend an international convention on Youth Leadership hosted by Zhengzhou No. 9 High School in Zhengzhou, China. We were the largest delegation of all schools, China and U.S. As representatives of U.S, Mrs. Johnson and Justis K. spoke at the opening ceremony, and Claire R. at the closing ceremony. In the 3-day convention, students were divided and mixed into 16 groups with students from all over the China. They participated in various leadership training activities, suggested and presented solutions to all sorts of social and school problems. All U-Prep students represented our school very well and made new friends from all over the world.

It was a wonderful trip!! We could feel the changes of our students on the trip. For example, many, first time out of the country, became more appreciative of their parents and what they have here in the States, more interested in cross-culture communications, and developed a deeper understanding of what it meant to be a global citizen as stipulated in our SLO's (Student Learning Outcomes – See Below).


