

# MATHCOUNTS COMPETITION








The **AP Retreat** is an intense weekend of content specific **AP Exam** prep combined with confidence building activities. # MOCK TRIAL


U-Prep's Mock Trial team took part in two case scrimmages during the month of January in preparation for the upcoming County Mock Trial Competition in February. The second scrimmage was in Santa Clara and included 22 teams from around Northern California. Our team has been practicing one to two nights per week since August as the students learn courtroom legalese and prepare their own trial. This year's case is titled "People v. Hayes" and the trial is about Jamie Hayes, a student on a track and field scholarship. Hayes faces a felony charge of murder for the homicide on May 15, 2014, of Lee Valdez, a campus security guard. Hayes is raising the affirmative defense of defense of another in order to claim the homicide was justifiable. Students have prepared a complete trial, including pre-trial to argue the Fifth Amendment, from opening statements to closing arguments with witness examinations and cross-examinations.

This year is U-Prep's third year competing in this National and Statewide Program, prepared and supported by the Constitutional Rights Foundation (CRF). The goal of the Mock Trial Program is to help students acquire a working knowledge of our judicial system, develop analytical abilities and communication skills, and gain an understanding of the legal system and their obligations and responsibilities as participating members of our society. The presentation skills the students hone are some of the most effective skills to carry them in their future.

The Mock Trial team is comprised of approximately 18 high school students, a Teacher Advisory/Coach (Cathy Armstrong) and two Attorney Coaches (Cedar Vaughan and Melissa Fanoe), both attorneys in the Redding community. In the fall, CRF distributes facts about a "mock" criminal case that students then use to create their own defense and prosecution cases. Students learn about admissible evidence, closing arguments, US Amendments, the legal proceedings, objections, debate and presentation skills, team work and cooperation, analytic ability and many other valuable skills.

The County Mock Trial Competition will be held in the Shasta County Courthouse, with a presiding judge, on February 16, 17 and 18<sup>th</sup> with high schools from the county competing for a spot to continue on to the State Competition.

Teen Drivers must have valid California Learners permits and proof of insurance. Parents or Guardians must execute a liability release and responsibility statement.

If student is using a MyTeam car a fee for insurance and other costs will be applied.
