## Principal's Corner continued...


- College Credit: The survey showed a very high percentage of parents desiring college credit within the high school program. It is a pleasure to share that our strategic plan outlines an initiative for this to happen. Systems are steadily being put in place to allow our students to graduate from high school having also completed 1-2 years of their post-secondary general education transfer curriculum. This program would be delivered by our teachers, offered on-campus within the current academic schedule, and would function seamlessly for students already engaged in Advanced Placement college-level coursework.
- 2) ACT/SAT Test Prep: Parental feedback shows this as another area of high interest. Also a part of our strategic plan, options for test prep will become increasingly diversified. We are in the process of identifying potential vendors for an on-campus SAT/ACT test prep course. Additionally, as was communicated in an earlier newsletter, there are a variety of options for students to access in preparation for these exams. However, courses delivered by instructors often provide the opportunity for a more personalized learning experience. The newly designed SAT will roll out this spring; potential vendors will be sufficiently prepared to deliver test prep with these changes in mind.
- 3) Advanced Placement Test Prep: Parents, teachers, and students expressed interest in extended prep for AP exams. Our Advanced Placement department is currently developing a new test prep opportunity for AP students this spring. As these details come together they will be shared with our students and parents.
- 4) School Safety: This is our number one priority. As such, there are many different actions taken towards this priority on a regular basis. That said, U-Prep has a comprehensive School Safety Plan. Our School Safety Committee reviews and updates the plans annually based on current needs, legislative updates, law enforcement collaboration, and feedback following practice drills. Students and staff discuss, review, and practice identified protocols throughout the school year. Our relationship with local law enforcement is excellent. They afford assistance with drills, traffic safety issues, and various other general safety matters.
- 5) Small Classes, Small Middle & High School Programs: Close-knit community of teachers/ advisors: A high percentage of parents placed significant value on these features of the school program, which was wonderful to see. A smaller school setting coupled with supportive relationships creates for healthy culture of success and achievement!

On another note, I'm pleased to share that the Stuart Gymnasium will be receiving some much needed attention, including a new gym floor. Upgrades and repairs will take place in all areas of the structure. The work will begin before school is out in May and continue throughout the summer. This is an exciting project and will be well worth the wait!






