Pursuing Excellence Together

Congratulations to Allison T., U-Prep's selection for Rotary's Freshmen of the Year award, and to Ms. Wilhelm, Rotary's selection for Secondary Teacher of the Year award! Luncheons are scheduled this month to honor Allison and Ms. Wilhelm for their hard work, dedication, and commitment to excellence. More celebrations are included in this month's newsletter, including Rotary scholarship recipients, visual and performing arts awards, and athletic program successes.

U-Prep was awarded a **GOLD MEDAL** badge by the <u>U.S. News and World Report: Best High Schools</u>; State rank is #41, National rank #263, and Charter School rank #75. *Congratulations* to our students, staff, and U-Prep families! Data used to determine awards included state assessment data, graduation rates, and how well each school prepares all of their students for college. College readiness was determined using the Advanced Placement (AP) participation rate – the number of 12th grade students who took at least one AP test before or during their senior year, divided by the number of seniors. Further, a quality-adjusted participation rate was calculated based on the number of 12th grade students who took and passed at least one of the tests before or during their senior year, divided by the number of 12th graders at the school. An AP score of 3 or higher is considered passing. On point with AP, 49% of our high school students are will be engaged in AP exams during the first two weeks in May. We wish them the best of luck. Go Panthers! A special note of appreciation to our wonderful AP teachers for preparing students for the exams, and for providing an additional opportunity for success through offering an AP Retreat at Lassen Pines Camp.

On another note, we are very excited to share U-Prep's new logo and school motto! The process leading to the final outcome was a joint effort with staff and student leaders. We are pleased to unveil the logo in this month's newsletter, In The Spotlight section. Our school motto, Pursuing Excellence Together, was the added fruit of this thoughtful branding process. U-Prep is not a school to sit on its laurels; rather, we are a learning community that strives to be responsive to the ever-changing needs of our students while staying on point with our Charter mission. This is a genuine team effort, one that requires all of us to grow, learn and be fully engaged in helping students develop their abilities and talents. We are excited about the work we are doing with young people and enjoy supporting them in going as far as they want to go! Thank you for your continued support.

regards to these end of year celebrations.






7th Grade


Perfect Attendance

8th Grade East Coast Trip


